**Whereas**, the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution on 24 June 2014 was awarded recognition as a Commemorative Partner in accordance with Public Law 110-181 Sec.598 to assist and support a grateful nation in thanking and honoring our Vietnam War Veterans for their Service, Valor and Sacrifice; and

**Whereas**, the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, as descendants of the heroes of the America Revolution who by their sacrifices established the United States of America and gave us the principles of liberty and our Constitutional Republic, affirm our support to honor those patriots who answered the call and received the Vietnam Service Medal for service to country; and

**Whereas**, the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, per the first Commemoration Objective, shall seek ways and means to thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war or listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans; and

**Now, therefore**, the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution hereby proclaims 24 June 2014 through 11 November 2025 as the period of Commemoration for the **50<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE Vietnam WAR.**

## **ABOUT THE United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration FLAG**

"The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration" is the official title given to the Department of Defense program in the 2008 National Defense Authorization Act. The traditional use of the color gold to signify a 50th Anniversary was chosen for the phrase "50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary" and symbolizes the specific mission of the Department of Defense program as outlined in the Congressional language "to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War."

A representation of the Vietnam Service Medal (ribbon) rests below the inner rings.

The red, white, and blue inner rings represent the flag of the United States of America and recognize all Americans, both military and civilian, who served or contributed to the Vietnam War effort.

The outer black ring serves as a reminder of those who were held as prisoners of war or listed as missing in action during the Vietnam War. The black ring surrounds the red, white, and blue rings to call attention to their sacrifices, the sacrifices of their families, and the defense of our nation's freedom.

Within the blue ring are the words "Service, Valor and Sacrifice"; virtues demonstrated by our veterans during the Vietnam War. The gold-rimmed white star located between the words "Service" and "Valor" represents hope for the families of those veterans for which there has not been a full accounting. The blue-rimmed gold star located between the words "Valor" and "Sacrifice" represents the families of those veterans who paid the ultimate sacrifice during the war. The blue star at the bottom of the inner blue ring represents the families of all veterans and symbolizes their support from home.

At the bottom of the inner blue ring are six white stars, three on each side of the blue star. These six white stars symbolize the contributions and sacrifices made by the United States and its Allies, Australia, New Zealand, Philippines, Republic of Korea, and Thailand.

The center circle contains a map of Vietnam in black outline relief, signifying both the country and the Vietnamese veterans who stood with our veterans. The subdued outlines of Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, and surrounding waters represent the area of operation where U.S. Armed Forces served. The green laurel wreath signifies honor for all who served.

The phrase "A Grateful Nation Thanks and Honors You" is the personal message to each veteran, civilian, family member, and all who served and sacrificed during the Vietnam War.

The seal's blue background is the same color as the canton in the United States Flag. When placed next to the flags of World War II and the Korean War Commemoration Flags, the Vietnam War Commemoration Flag will signify the Vietnam Veterans taking their rightful place among generations of U.S. veterans.

### COMMEMORATION OBJECTIVES

1. To thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war or listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans.
2. To highlight the service of the Armed Forces during the Vietnam War and the contributions of Federal agencies and governmental and non-governmental organizations that served with, or in support of, the Armed Forces.
3. To pay tribute to the contributions made on the home front by the people of the United States during the Vietnam War.
4. To highlight the advances in technology, science, and medicine related to military research conducted during the Vietnam War.
5. To recognize the contributions and sacrifices made by the allies of the United States during the Vietnam War.

## The NSSAR Vietnam War Veterans Corps Survey

On 24 June 2014 the Vietnam War Veterans Corps is 305 strong. If you served in the Vietnam War, complete the form below and return it to the NSSAR Veterans Recognition Committee Chairman.

When approved by the NSSAR Veterans Recognition Committee\*, a Certificate of Patriotism for your service as a member of the United States Armed Forces will be signed by the NSSAR President General and sent to your chapter, through the Secretary of your State Society. At an appropriate chapter, state or national meeting, the Certificate of Patriotism will be presented to you.

### Key Campaign Medals Associated with Vietnam Service

Vietnam Era Veterans are eligible if they served during the Vietnam War pursuant to the Code of Federal Regulations Chapter 8 Paragraph 3.2 (f) during the period beginning on February 28, 1961 and ending on May 7, 1975, inclusive. **A Vietnam Era Veteran with a standalone National Defense Service Medal (NDSN) is not eligible.** Stated differently, in the absence of a Vietnam Service Medal (VSM) and/or Vietnam Campaign Medal (VCM) having been awarded along with a National Defense Service Medal for service in the Republic of Vietnam, a Compatriot is not eligible for the NSSAR Vietnam War Veterans Corps.

### \*Veterans Recognition Committee Responsibility

The Veterans Recognition Committee is responsible for promoting and conducting programs designed to recognize those Compatriots who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces or other military forces allied with the United States, including, but not limited to the WWII Veterans Corps, the Korean Service Veterans Corps and the Vietnam War Veterans Corps, and the SW Asia Persian Gulf War. The Committee is responsible for monitoring the requirements for presentation of the War Service Medal and Military Service Medal and for developing certificate recognition programs to commemorate participation in specific armed conflicts.

#### **NSSAR Policy Concerning the War Service Medal and/or Military Service Medal is presented in**

**The War Service Medal (WSM)** was first authorized in 1899 for members who had served in the Spanish-American War. It was subsequently authorized for members who served in World War I and World War II. Following World War II, the NSSAR authorized a generic War Service Medal with specific service periods indicated by bronze bars. The medal is bronze and may be presented by a chapter, state society, or the NSSAR to SAR members (or purchased by SAR members).

**Proof of service**, in the form of a copy of the member's discharge (or other U.S. or Allied Government proof in the case of a member in active service), must be presented to the NSSAR Veterans Recognition Committee, State Society Secretary or Chapter Secretary (depending on presenting authority) before the medal can be purchased and/or worn. Such proof must show that the Compatriot: (1) Served, or is serving, honorably in the armed forces of the United States, the military forces of a country allied with the United States, or a United Nations Peace Keeping Force; (2) Served against a common enemy in a war or action recognized by a branch of the Armed Forces of the United States; and (3) Received a campaign medal, combat ribbon or badge as shown on the DD-214 form or equivalent.

A bronze bar is available to indicate service during the Vietnam War. It may be attached to WSM drape. Or at the Compatriot's discretion an Oak leaf cluster may be worn to recognize participation in the Vietnam War. The precedence level for the WSM is 4.

**The Military Service Medal (MSM)**, authorized in 2006, may be presented to a Compatriot in recognition of military service which does not otherwise qualify for the WSM. **Proof of service** as noted above is required before the medal can be purchased and/or worn. **The precedence levels** for the **MSM** and **WSM** are the **same**, i.e., **precedence 4**. A Compatriot may NOT wear both the **MSM** and the **WSM** at the same time.

**BEFORE** starting on your NSSAR Vietnam War Veterans Corps Survey Form below, please follow the “Save” instructions.

Use the “Save to Your PC” button. Add the Veteran’s Name to the front of the Saved file Name. For example, “George Compatriot Vietnam War Veterans Corps Form.PDF”. Now **CLOSE** the web page and **OPEN** the saved File on your PC to Continue.
